Presider: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: Galatians 3:23–29 - Dylan Leggard

Reader: The first reading is taken from the third chapter of the Epistle to
the Galatians, beginning at the third verse.

²³ Before the coming of this faith, we were held in custody under the law,
locked up until the faith that was to come would be revealed. ²⁴ So the law
was our guardian until Christ came that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵ Now
that this faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian. ²⁶ So in Christ
Jesus you are all children of God through faith, ²⁷ for all of you who were
baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ²⁸ There is neither
Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you

are all one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹ If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

Gospel Reading: John 1:1–14 – Norma Leggard

Reader: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to the first chapter of Saint John, beginning at the first verse.

All: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Confession and Absolution

Presider: You then, who truly and earnestly repent of your sins, and are in love and charity with your neighbours, and intend to lead the new life, following the commandments of God, and walking from this day forward in his holy ways: draw near with faith, and take this holy sacrament to your comfort; and make your humble confession to almighty God. *Silence.*

All: **Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, maker of all things, judge of all, we acknowledge and confess our many sins, which we have committed by thought, word, and deed, against your divine majesty. We earnestly repent, and are truly sorry for all our misdoings. Have mercy on us, most merciful Father. For your Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake forgive us all that is past, and grant that from now on we may always serve and please you in lives wholly renewed by your Spirit, to the honour and glory of your name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Presider: Almighty God our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all who turn to him with heartfelt repentance and true faith: have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and

strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to eternal life,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper, Jesus took the cup and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying: "Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." **Amen.**
