Prayer of Adoration

Leader: God of grace and of wonder, you are the light of the minds that know you, the life of the souls that love you and the strength of those who serve you. In you we have our beginning and our end and in you we find our life's purpose. We come to worship, to marvel in your goodness and seek your truth, as we offer all

praise and honour to you, with Christ and the Holy Spirit, One God, mighty and merciful, now and always.

In recalling all that you do and all that you are, we remember what we have done and who we are; and so to begin again with you and each other, we confess our sins:

Confession and Assurance of Pardon

All: God of mystery and mercy, we confess that we too often mistake our own desires for your will. We are distracted by our own desires and disappointments and we cling to fantasies and false promises. We fear for the future rather than seeking signs of hope and we preserve what is, rather than work for what you desire to be. Forgive our sins against you and against one another, we pray, in thought, word, and deed, and help us become who you made us to be, in Jesus' name. Amen.

Leader: Scripture reminds us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23), but "if we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). So let us receive the truth that we are forgiven through God's love in Jesus Christ. God offers us mercy and new of life this day, as every other day. Let us at peace with God, with ourselves and with one another.

The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: 2 Peter 1:16–21 – Marcus Berger

Reader: A reading from first chapter of the second Epistle of Peter, beginning at verse 16.

¹⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised stories when we told you about the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in power, but we were eye-witnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ He received honour and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, “This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.” ¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain.

¹⁹ We also have the prophetic message as something completely reliable, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰ Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet’s own interpretation of things. ²¹ For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell face down to the ground, terrified. ⁷ But Jesus came and touched them. “Get up,” he said. “Don’t be afraid.” ⁸ When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.

⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus instructed them, “Don’t tell anyone what you have seen, until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.”
